

Problem solving up to 8

Calculate:

$$5 + 3 = \boxed{8}$$

$$7 - 2 = \boxed{5}$$

$$3 + 3 = \boxed{6}$$

$$5 - 3 = \boxed{2}$$

$$2 + 6 = \boxed{8}$$

$$6 - 0 = \boxed{6}$$

$$1 + 5 = \boxed{6}$$

$$8 - 4 = \boxed{4}$$

$$4 + 4 = \boxed{8}$$

$$8 - 1 = \boxed{7}$$

1. Kay has 8 sweets. He eats 3. How many sweets does he have left? $8 - 3 = 5$ sweets
2. Beth has 4 sweets. Tom gives her another 2 sweets. How many sweets does Beth have? $4 + 2 = 6$ sweets.
3. Ken has 6 balls and David has 2 balls. How many balls do they have altogether? $6 + 2 = 8$ balls.
4. Don has 8 fish, but 4 of the fish die. How many fish does he have left? $8 - 4 = 4$ fish.
